The General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous USA/Canada oversees AAWS and other incorporated subsidiaries such as AA Grapevine on behalf of the US/ Canadian General Service Conference.

According to the US/Canadian Conference Charter, the right to publish Conference-approved literature is delegated to the General Service Board of countries with an AA Structure. In Australia that is the General Service Board of AA (Australia).

While the US/Canadian Conference holds ultimate authority over AA copyrighted materials, the General Service Board of Australia believes that as a matter of principle the Australia fellowship ought to be able to have a say in any decision-making processes affecting the fellowship globally.

In November 2023, Conference resolved to explore ways for the Australian fellowship to participate in decisions regarding literature changes. Australian World Service Delegates are working towards this goal alongside other international delegates. The Australian GSB will continue discussions on this matter and explore options for Australian fellowship to have representation in decisions regarding our literature.
